

Interview with Prof. Matin Patel from UNIGE

Prof. Martin Patel is the project manager of SWEET DeCarbCH





Question: What do you find most exciting in SWEET DeCarbCH?

Answer: M. Patel: DeCarbCH directly addresses the needs of towns and cities in the context of decarbonisation. The canton of Geneva, the city of Zurich and many other municipalities aim to drastically reduce their CO2 emissions within one to two decades. Thermal grids of different types will play a key role for achieving the CO2 emission reduction targets. In addition, there are very interesting, unexploited opportunities in the industry sector. We aim to learn from each other and share our insights in order to facilitate and accelerate this important transition!

Q: How did this project start?

M. Patel: In DeCarbCH, we are building on the collaboration we had until end of 2020 in the Swiss Competence Centers for Energy Efficiency (SCCERs) related to the built environment (FEEB&D), industry (EIP), energy storage (HaE), modelling (JA-S&M) as well as socio-economic aspects (CREST). The members of the management have been involved in these projects, next to several others. Perhaps most importantly, we have been working together very effectively in the management team, right from the decision to jointly submit a proposal.

Q: This project started recently, what are the most important steps to take for the next few months?

M. Patel: After having had the project kick-off meeting in spring, we first need to ensure good collaboration within the work packages before we start connecting them in a few months from now. Somewhat later, in spring 2022, we will organize our annual conference, which will also play an important role in bringing the groups together and integrating the cooperation partners (companies, utilities, associations, engineering firms etc.) participating in DeCarbCH.
